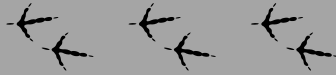


Wildlife Leadership Academy

Pennsylvania Bucktails, July 6-10

This wildlife focused leadership program will equip you with the necessary skills to become ambassadors for conservation in your home community. In addition to intensive field experiences in wildlife biology, this program will help you develop important leadership skills, such as public speaking, critical thinking, and team work.

The Wildlife Leadership Academy brings the biological expertise of Audubon PA, Kutztown University, PA Game Commission, Penn State University, the Ruffed Grouse Society, Quality Deer Management Association, and other partners, directly to high school students. Major topics covered during each 5 day residential field camp include:

WILDLIFE BIOLOGY

- Explore wildlife anatomy and physiology by participating in a necropsy under the guidance of wildlife veterinarians.
- Develop a deeper understanding of the annual cycle and behavior of each particular species.



HABITAT AND MANAGEMENT

- Assess habitat quality with expert biologist in the field assessing habitat quality and collecting and preserving important plants used by deer or grouse for food, shelter, and cover.



RESEARCH AND MONITORING TECHNIQUES

- Experience for yourself how biologists use technologies such as radio telemetry, GPS, infra-red imagery and cameras to study and monitor wildlife.



ROLE OF HUNTING IN WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT

- Learn what role hunting plays in wildlife management.
- Spend time at a local sportsman's club learning about gun safety and firing with expert instructors.

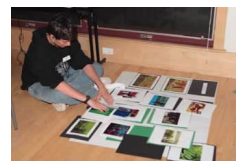
NATURE PHOTOGRAPHY AND JOURNALING

- Develop your skills in nature photography under the guidance of experts.
- Reflect on daily activities and experiences by creating your own nature journal.



COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND EDUCATION

- Spend time with radio, television, and writing professionals engaging in mock interviews and more to prepare you for communicating with the media.
- After the field school, we will continue to mentor you throughout the year as you participate in at least three public outreach and/or service activities in wildlife and habitat conservation.
